Physical Competency: Health and Well-Being Programs.

Our community wellness initiatives have continued to impact lives. In April, we invited health nurses from Bubaare Health Centre to conduct medical check-ups and seminar a wellness seminars, addressing preventable diseases and promoting active lifestyles. Our students at Akanyijuka Nursery and Primary School gained some knowledge that help prevent diseases such as malaria.

We are deeply grateful to our donor for introducing golf to the students sponsored through Victory Africa Sponsorship. Twenty students participated in a golfing clinic, benefiting from both physical and mental wellness.

Social Competency: Strengthening Relationships and Unity.

Social cohesion remains at the heart of Victory Africa Ministries' mission. During the school holidays we organized youth mentorship Camp that focused on interpersonal communication, conflict resolution, and teamwork. During Camp, students learned communication strategies to improve understanding and rebuild trust. Some students say that they finished the camp ready to engage in a meaningful conversations improve relationships.

Spiritual Competency: Faith and Discipleship Initiatives.

Akanyijuka School has continued to teach the mind and nourishing the souls of young people. Students at Akanyijuka Primary School have chapel every Monday and Friday. They conduct regular Bible study sessions, mentorship programs, and prayer. The spiritual formation of students both in primary and post primary institutions was one of our major focus in the last three months.



Brian, a young man who was battling with addiction, found hope through our discipleship program. With encouragement from mentors that stood by him, he turned his life around. Today, he leads Bible study sessions at Solberg College where he is a student and is inspiring others with his testimony of redemption.

Since its founding in 2007, Akanyijuka Nursery and Primary School has been more than just an academic institution. Born from a compassionate vision to care for orphaned and vulnerable children in the heart of Kabale Region, it began as a children's home and has grown into a sanctuary where love, dignity, and holistic support define everyday life.

Over the years, while the classrooms have expanded and the number of bright young learners has grown, Akanyijuka's mission has remained steadfast—offering not just education, but emotional and social nourishment to every child who walks through its gates.

This quarter, one story stands out—one that embodies the school's spirit of empathy and healing. It is the story of Precious, a young girl whose strength has quietly bloomed amidst sorrow.

Precious lost her mother earlier this year, a tragedy that cast a deep shadow over her young life. But she was not alone. Akanyijuka's dedicated team of social workers stepped in,

providing consistent counseling sessions and guiding her through the weight of grief. More than that, they nurtured a compassionate environment where fellow students came together to support her—not through grand gestures, but through quiet companionship, shared



smiles, and the understanding silence that only children who care deeply can offer.

Through this tender network of support, Precious began to heal. She discovered resilience not as something inherited, but as something cultivated—through love, community, and faith in brighter days ahead. Today, she stands stronger, reminding all of us that with the right guidance and heart, even life's hardest moments can be transformed into growth.

Environmental and Occupational Competencies

In April, our Coordinator for Agri-Based Small Businesses, along with three dedicated staff members from Victory Africa Ministries, embarked on a transformative monitoring and evaluation visit to women farmers. The passion and commitment of these women to embrace sustainable agriculture were truly inspiring. By adopting eco-friendly farming methods, they have not only reduced soil degradation and increased harvest yields but have also set a shining example for neighboring villages. For instance, Monica's innovative use of rabbit feces and urine as fertilizer has led to a thriving vegetable garden, bursting with health and vitality.



Our small agri-based training programs are designed to empower individuals with practical skills crucial for job readiness. Recently, we organized two dynamic workshops focused on entrepreneurship and business management specifically for women in Rubanda district. About 20 participants from Kibare village took part, eager to seize new opportunities.



One remarkable story is that of Jessica, a widow and mother of four who faced challenges after losing her husband. Last year, she participated in our entrepreneurial workshops, where she received invaluable mentorship and hands-on learning. With newfound

knowledge and determination, Jessica successfully launched her own small pig-gery business. Today, she not only employs two others but also thrives in her venture, transforming her family's future. Jessica now provides for her children, contributes to her church community, and serves as a beacon of hope and a mentor to other women aspiring to create sustainable livelihoods. Her journey exemplifies how opportunity and resilience can lead to profound change.
