Dear Beloved Friend and Ministry Partner, Merry Christams to you all. This year has been a year of journeys—some long, some painful, some unexpected—and yet through all of them, God has shown us His goodness. As you read this newsletter, we pray you will see the roads you helped pave, the tears you helped wipe away, and the futures you helped build.

The Child Whose Story Began With Tears.

In October, we gathered at Bishop Stuart University to celebrate the graduation of Daphne a student sponsored through Victory Africa Ministries. Victory Africa Ministries Fosters the flourishing of children at risk by developing their competencies in eight dimensions of life. Each child is connected to a sponsor whom faithfully provides financial resources that are used to develop a child holistically. Today Victory Africa is sponsoring 96 children. Daphne was an abandoned child. At the age of five she was left to be cared for by her old grandmother who barely had nothing. But a sponsor stepped into Daphne's life—offering her an opportunity to stay at Akanyijuka Children's home and to be educated.



Daphne, graduated as a lawyer, determined to stand as a pillar of peace and justice in Uganda. Her success story is a powerful testament to how education, mentorship, and faith-based support can transform not only one life but entire communities. This story is powerful, but it is not rare. Research now shows that children in Victory Africa grow notably in confidence, resilience, moral character, and relational health.



Another Success Story this year: Early last year, our social worker visited a home tucked deep in the hills near Kabale city. Inside, a young girl named Jannet sat quietly, dressed in dirty and torn clothes. She had dropped out of school months earlier. Her mother whispered, "I no longer know how to help five children." Her mother looked confused and frustrated with life. Five of her children sat silently as the mother narrates the her story. We gathered information about this family and an appeal was made to find sponsorship for this family. That same month, their sponsorship began. We purchased school uniforms, helped them return to school at Akanyijuka Primary School. Our teachers invited Jannet into our mentorship gatherings. Months later, she graduated from Kindergarten to Primary One. On her graduation, she stands at the front of her class, confidently reading aloud. Every time she finishes a paragraph, she smiles. This is not just school support. This is dignity restored. This is childhood restored. This is her future rewritten. Because someone like you reached out. Victory Africa Mentorship: In victory Africa Ministries we met teenagers who once questioned their worth: some of these teenagers struggled academically Some lacked emotional support, Some were dealing with rejection Some had no clear voice speaking into their future. So we sat with them— after school, in church halls, outside class-



rooms—and spoke truth to them. This approach has helped ten students this year who were going to leave schooling. Jonathan a double orphan without parents recently to Auntie Peace a (Social Work and Project Administrator that, "Before this mentorship, I used to feel small. Now I know I can become a Doctor." Jonathan's future is quietly taking shape.

Your giving opens doors for more students like Daphne—future leaders who will bring hope, reconciliation, and transformation to Uganda and beyond. Whether studying law, leadership, or community development, these young people are being equipped to serve with integrity, peace, and justice. To keep these stories growing, we need to raise support for children's education, medical care, and mentorship. Sponsorship covers school fees, meals, medical support, and mentorship.



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Street Ministry Humura Boy's

In this project we currently sponsor 19 former street boys. Five boys are in primary school and 14 children in secondary school.

Academic Progress: We are excited to report that the children have completed the 2025 academic year with great joy and remarkable progress. This year, Humura boys performed exceptionally well across all levels. Their reading ability has noticeably improved since returning for third term on 8th Sept 2025. Many have also shown increased interest and excellence in their favorite subjects, aligning well with their long-term goals.

Academic Milestones for 2025: Primary Seven (P7) graduates: 2, Primary Six: 1, Primary Five: 1 Primary One: 1, Top Class (Nursery): 3 Senior One (S1) completed: 3, Senior Two (S2) completed: 4, Senior Three (S3) completed: 2, Senior Four (S4) completed: 2 and Senior Five (S5) completed: 1

Student Highlights: Brian Completed Senior Four (O-Level)

Brian has finished Senior Four at Soulburg College with outstanding commitment and determination. His journey reflects academic strength, strong character, and resilience. He is now preparing to take the next step in his education with confidence.

Nicholas Completed Primary Seven. Nicholas has shown great enthusiasm, curiosity, and consistent hard work. Completing P7 is a significant milestone, opening a new pathway toward adolescence and allowing him to secondary school learning.

End of Term: On 28th November 2025, all children successfully broke off for holidays after completing a productive term filled with learning, growth, and improvement in both academic and personal development.

Spiritual Growth: Humura Ministries continues to prioritize spiritual development. Children are guided in nurturing their faith in Jesus Christ, learning Scripture, and understanding Christian values. Many have grown in purpose, strength, and confidence as they develop personal spiritual disciplines and moral foundations. Although there are some who are still struggling but the progress is impressive. Our staff have learned this through years of struggle and failure. We hope that more children in our care will become stronger followers of Jesus now forward.

Physical Activities and Recreation: To promote physical wellness and teamwork, the children actively participate in: Soccer competition, Netball and we have recently got a sponsor to support children in victory Africa ministries to learn Golf. Sports play a vital role in helping them stay healthy, build friendships, and develop discipline.



Mental and Emotional Well-Being: Counseling sessions are regularly conducted by our Social Worker and Project Administrator. These sessions help the children: Build emotional resilience, Stay focused in school, Overcome past trauma and Develop confidence and a positive self-image. The results have been evident in improved academic performance and stronger interpersonal relationships.

Meet some of Humura Boys and their Stories:

Davis Mugarura Innocent (Age 19) – Senior Three – Future Doctor: Davis once lived on the streets, struggling each day for survival without a safe home or access to basic needs.

Everything changed when Humura Ministries reached out and welcomed him with care, love, and mentorship. Davis Joined Akanyijuka Primary School and completed his primary education successfully. Progressed into secondary school with strong performance and discipline Has now completed Senior Three at Solberg College. His ambitious to become a doctor.



Darshil Katabazi (Age 18) – Senior Two – Future Engineer



Barshil also grew up as a street boy, facing hunger, insecurity, and hardship. Humura Ministries became his home, offering safety, love, and guidance. He joined Humara Homes and later joined Akanyijuka Nursery and Primary School. After completing primary school with consistent improvement. Joined secondary school and has now completed Senior Two at Soulburg College. Barshil's transformation shows how opportunity changes lives of the former street children.

Sufficient Owakubariho (Age 16) – Senior Three – Future Doctor

Sufficient spent his childhood homeless, uncertain of where to sleep or find food. When Humura Ministries found him, everything changed.

He moved into Humura Homes and received shelter, counseling, spiritual support, and education. He then joined Akanyijuka Primary School and soon ranked among the top students, especially in Mathematics and English. He is now in Senior Three at St. Mary's College Rushoroza, a school that we believe will give an opportunity to fulfil his dream of becoming a medical doctor. Today, Sufficient is confident, hopeful, and committed to building a brighter future.

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Improving the Financial Competencies of Women: A Story of Transformation and Sustainable Change

Before the Victory Small-Agro Based Business (VSABB) initiative reached Jennifer's village, most women lived in quiet struggle. Jennifer, a mother of three, carried private fears about school fees, feeding her children, and sustaining her household. Women rarely gathered, and when they did, conversations stayed shallow. Many believed their problems were personal failures rather than shared realities.

That began to change when VSABB formed its first group in the village. Thirty-four women gathered under a tree—curious, hesitant, but hopeful. The sessions were simple: discussions, prayer, lessons in financial literacy, and shared testimonies. But within



weeks, something deeper took root. By the third meeting, the awkward stillness had been replaced with laughter, shared tears, and trust.

Today, Jennifer does not walk alone. She harvests alongside other women when someone is sick. She contributes to a shared emergency fund so that no family goes hungry. She travels with neighbors to hospital visits—not only to support financially, but emotionally. During one meeting, Jennifer wiped tears from her eyes and said: "For the first time in many years, I feel like I belong. I have sisters who care about me." Her words capture what VSABB represents: restored dignity, community belonging, and economic confidence.

Knowledge That Improves Health and Reduces Costs

In our latest interviews, nine women testified that learning about balanced diets, clean water usage, exercise, and preventive care has helped them reduce medical expenses. They reported fewer illnesses among their children and less emergency borrowing for treatment. Women have now requested additional trainers to deepen knowledge in physical well-being—proof of ownership, not dependence.

Stability Emerging Within Families

As women gain knowledge, relationships within homes are changing. Training on rights and communication has led to: reduced domestic conflict, fewer separations, shared decision-making, and improved child welfare. Women now confidently discuss vaccination schedules, nutrition, and family planning. Husbands have begun recognizing women as meaningful contributors—not just helpers. One beneficiary said, "I no longer fear standing up for what is right for my children." This shift is reshaping households from the inside out.

Financial Skills Turning Into Real Income

Financial transformation is now visible across the groups. Women are setting personal savings goals, budgeting confidently, starting income-generating activities, and planning ahead rather than reacting in crisis.



Interviews revealed that women no longer wait for external support—they initiate change within their families. A powerful model of sustainability has emerged from four groups that used their post-loan savings to purchase mother pigs. Select women take responsibility for feeding, housing, and caring for the pigs. When the pigs produce litters, piglets are passed on to other members. This cycle ensures every household benefits.

Projected outcomes include income supporting: school fees, household food needs, farming inputs, and medical bills. The revolving pig investment has become a community-owned economic engine.

Accountability That Builds Trust

Every quarter, field teams compile reports mapping impact, repayment progress, and financial behavior changes. These reports are presented to the service director and shared with the Board to guide planning—ensuring transparency and program refinement.

Measurable Change, Communitywide Impact

Across villages, transformation is visible: Women are making informed decisions. Children are healthier and attending school consistently. Savings groups are expanding without external pressure. New groups are applying for training because existing members are influencing change.

Households are stabilizing, livelihoods are growing, and communities are shifting toward dignity, opportunity, and resilience.



What began as a weekly gathering has become a movement—women who once sat silently now stand with clarity and purpose. Through VSABB, financial competency has become more than skills. It has become peace of mind, a sense of belonging, and a pathway to sustainable livelihoods. This is transformation that can be measured, celebrated, and multiplied. Please pray for us that we may get the resources to continue this incredible work in our communities.
